FROM THE DESK OF ARTISTIC DIRECTOR FRANCES HILL

When television commentators talk endlessly about immigration, when the streets are crowded with protestors and President Trump is sending out executive orders, a comedy about immigration seems almost too perfectly timed. Why? Comedy comes from tragedy and times of strife and it is through comedy that we can most clearly see ourselves.

British playwright Ben Woolf actually wrote Angry Young Man ten years ago. It was a hit in London at Edinburgh Festival Fringe and the big winner at the Adelaide Festival in Australia. Carol Tambor, who gives a Best of Edinburgh Award each season, told me about the play and how it was one of her favorites. I found it creatively challenging, funny and a good choice for our spring show. I had often talked to Steve Hamilton about directing at Urban Stages. He said "find me the right play." Angry Young Man was it. The comedy all came together with a talented diverse cast, most of whom are immigrants or descendants of immigrants themselves. On our stage we have a first generation Greek actor, a Turkish actress here on an Artistic Visa, an actress of Haitian descent and an actor of Jewish heritage all bringing their unique backgrounds to their roles.

Since Steve has directed many shows at the John Drew Theater at Guild Hall, Urban Stages is working in association with Guild Hall. The play will immediately transfer to East Hampton with the cast and design team and open on May 31st to run through June 19th. If you have friends out East, please tell them not to miss this production.

Angry Young Man is the last production of Urban Stages' 2016-17 season. However,
